AMELIA ZITOUN WINS GOLD AT STULBERG!

Amelia Zitoun, 17 2023 GOLD MEDALIST United States cello

Amelia Zitoun, 17, is a scholarship Fellow at the Music Institute of Chicago's Academy, a training center for advanced pre-college students. She has been a student there since 2019. She currently studies cello with Hans Jensen.

Most recently Amelia was the 1st place winner of the Bolz Final Forte Competition in Madison, WI. In October of 2022, Amelia played the Barber Cello Concerto with the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra on their Family Concert and Youth Performance Series. In May of 2022 Amelia was the winner of the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra's Stars of Tomorrow Competition. She was also a winner of the 2022 Civic Music Association of Milwaukee's High School Competition. In 2021, Amelia won First Prize in the Schubert Club Competition, and in 2020 she was a winner of the DePaul Concerto Competition, performing the Kabalevsky Concerto with the Oistrakh Symphony Orchestra.

Amelia is also an active chamber musician. As a member of the Pelios String Quartet they recently won 2nd place in the 2023 Barnett Chamber Music Competition, and will be competing in the 2023 Fischoff National Chamber Music Competition, as well as the St. Paul String Quartet Competition. In 2022, as a member of the Hermes Piano Trio, she competed in the Quarterfinals of Fischoff. In 2020, as a member of the Aurora Piano Quartet, her group won First Prize in the Rembrandt Chamber Music Competition, as well as advancing to the Quarterfinals in the Fischoff National Chamber Music Competition.

This summer, Amelia will attend the Perlman Music Program. In the summer of 2022, Amelia attended the Heifetz International Music Institute, as well as the Moulin d'Ande Cello Festival in France, where she studied with Jerome Pernoo (Paris Conservatory).

The Calcifer and Pelios String Quartets have advanced to the finals of the 18th Annual Saint Paul String Quartet Competition, which will take place on Saturday April 22, 2023 (Junior Category). The Saint Paul String Quartet Competition's primary mission is to celebrate excellence in string quartet playing, foster an increased appreciation for the chamber music art form, and enhance the music culture in this country. Diversity and Inclusion are now at the forefront of the competition, and they have created required competition rounds for Women composers and Composers of Color.

The selection jury members were Andrew Jennings (Concord String Quartet), Mari Sato (Cavani String Quartet), John Largesse (Miró String Quartet), and Laura Sewell (Lark Quartet/Artaria String Quartet).

MARCH 2023

Cellist **Amelia Zitoun** won 1st place in Strings 2 division and **Lucy Wu** won 2nd place in the Strings 1 division of the **Schubert Club Student Scholarship Competition. Kana Aihara** was also a finalist in the Strings 2 division.

Violinist Zak Chen was selected as the Bryant Scholarship Winner for Wisconsin Philharmonic Shining Stars Competition. The name "Shining Stars" refers to students in the community who have exceptional musical talent. Zak was chosen unanimously by the judges to be the recipient of a \$1,500 Scholarship provided by Anthony and Andrea Bryant and the Wisconsin Philharmonic. The Wisconsin Philharmonic offers scholarships to middle and high school students who reside in Waukesha County. Auditions are held annually in the Spring. MIC is incredibly proud of Amelia and Academy cellist **Lucy Wu** (Honorable Mention), two of the four finalists who took the stage on March 8 to perform with the Madison Symphony Orchestra. Amelia studies with MIC affiliated faculty member Hans Jensen and Lucy is student of Stefan Kartman. The four finalists were chosen from eight competitors at the Bolz Young Artist Competition Semi-Finals for the opportunity to compete in The Final Forte. The Bolz Competition is a highly regarded statewide competition in which Wisconsin's young musicians compete for scholarships and the opportunity to perform as soloists with the MSO. Each winner receives a \$2000 scholarship and the Marian Bolz Prize for Distinguished Musical Achievement or the Steenbock Youth Music Award.

Amelia: "Both of my parents are musicians. My life is basically music. I listen to it all the time. I'm always thinking about it. It's my focus, it's my goal."

Bringing in students from all around the globe, the Stulberg International String Competition is a great way for gifted artists under the age of twenty to participate in an internationally recognized competition.

With a moving and powerful performance of Mendelssohn's Piano Trio No. 2 in C minor, Op. 66, first movement, the **Goya Piano Trio (Lily Sullivan, violin, Serge Kalinovsky, cello, and Noah Kim, piano)** students from the Music institute of Chicago Academy, won first place yesterday at the **Rembrandt Chamber Musicians 28th Annual Chamber Music Competition** in North Park's University's Anderson Chapel. The group, coached by MIC President Mark George and Academy faculty member Claudia Lasareff-Mironoff, has been together since September. Lily and Serge travel to the Academy each Saturday from Bloomington, IN.

Rembrandt founded its highly acclaimed Annual High School Chamber Music Competition in 1995. Winning ensembles receive cash prizes, coaching sessions from Rembrandt musicians, performance opportunities, and participate in educational outreach projects for Chicago-area schools.

The **West Suburban Symphony Society** is pleased to announce violinist **Tristan Zhu** the winner of the 74th Annual West Suburban Symphony Solo Competition for string, woodwind, and brass. Tristan will perform the Beethoven Violin Concerto in D Major with the symphony on May 7th at Hinsdale Central High School. Each year since its founding, the symphony has provided an opportunity for high-school musicians to compete to perform a solo work with orchestra.

JANUARY 2023

The DePaul Concerto Festival for Young Performers was founded in 2003 to provide an opportunity for intermediate level pianists in the Community Music Division to perform with an orchestra. In 2004, the Festival was expanded to include violin, In 2006, cello and flute were added to the roster of instruments. A partnership was formed in 2007 with the Oistrakh Symphony of

Chicago under the direction of Mina Zikri. In 2008, the Festival was opened to students outside of the Community Music Division, and today the DePaul Concerto Festival attracts nearly 150 participants in piano, strings, and woodwinds from the Midwest who audition for a chance to perform with the Oistrakh Symphony of Chicago.

Arthur D. Montzka Young Artist Competition, Northern Illinois

Congratulations to violinist **Neal Eisfeldt**, awarded Runner-Up in the **Kishwaukee Symphony Orchestra's Arthur D. Montzka Young Artists Concerto Competition**. Arthur Dale Montzka was the conductor of the Kishwaukee Symphony Orchestra for more than 20 years. During that time, the group expanded from a handful of amateur music-makers, practicing in church basements and high-school band rooms, to a full orchestra of more than 60 players performing a series of concerts for the public each year.

Mr. Montzka especially enjoyed working with young people, and he encouraged his private- and public-school students to join the orchestra. Knowing that there were many exceptionally talented young players in the area, he established the Kishwaukee Symphony Orchestra Concerto Competition. Since its inception in 1985-86, with the first concerto-competition winner announced in the 1986-87 season, more than 150 musicians have auditioned to play with the orchestra and four dozen have been selected for that opportunity. Many of the concerto winners have gone on to prestigious schools of music and successful artistic careers.

Up to two Honorable Mention scholarships of \$1000 may also be awarded.

Violinist Tristan Zhu was named the winner of the 69th Annual DuPage Symphony Orchestra | Young Artists Audition. The DSO strives to encourage serious study and musical excellence among young musicians through its annual Young Artists Auditions. The audition experience is designed to be both educational and rewarding for the participants. Tristan will receive a cash award of \$500 and the opportunity to appear as a soloist performing for 10-15 minutes with the DuPage Symphony Orchestra during the 2:00 PM & 4:00 PM "Our Talented Youth" concerts on Sunday, March 19, 2023.

The Sphinx Competition, held every year in Detroit (MI), is a national competition offering young Black and Latinx classical string players a chance to compete under the guidance of an internationally renowned panel of judges and to perform with and receive mentorship from established professional musicians. Exceptional young musicians from all corners of the country, competed in **Midwest Young Artists Conservatory's Annual Walgreens National Concerto Competition** at the end of December. Students from elementary through twelfth grades competed for more than \$20,000 in scholarships and

This is a particularly momentous year, as the masterclass schedule was interrupted by Covid, and because this event will coincide with the opening of Pablo Casals Concert Hall at Kronberg, where leading cellists will perform a series of concerts and masterclasses this year. Jan will be playing for Jans Peter Mainz, a professor at the Berlin University of the Arts and a renowned soloist.
